88-015: *A Bill to Provide Funding to the Caf So That They Can Upgrade to Eco-friendly Materials*

Abstract:

This is a bill that will allow for SGA to provide \$2000.00 from the special projects fund (81-xxxx-8270) in order for the cafeteria to switch to Eco-Friendly materials for four months. SGA will be paying the difference for the upgrade from plastic/styrofoam material to biodegradable material. Below the prices for upgradable materials are outlined:

The Paper Hinged 3comp 9X9 Boxes 2/75ct are \$45.71---Normal ones 150ct \$16.45 (\$74.97 difference)

Eco Knife Beige 1/1000ct \$58.46 ---Normal 1/1000 \$24.28 (\$34.18 difference)

Eco Fork Beige 1/1000ct \$59.79 --- Normal 1/1000 \$24.28 (\$35.51 difference)

Eco Spoon Beige 1/1000ct \$58.46 --- Normal 1/1000 \$24.28 (\$34.18 difference)

Whereas, by switching over to biodegradable materials, SGA will be helping to eliminate waste produced by the college,

Whereas, by switching to biodegradable materials, SGA will continue to support its initiative of helping the environment.

Recognizing, that by contributing \$2000.00 those materials are anticipated to last approximately four months (based on the college being on yellow status).

Recognizing, that these materials could either deplete quicker or last longer depending on if the college enters a status below yellow or above yellow.

Whereas, the Environmental Action Club serves to act in the best interest of the college and the sustainability of the environment.

Recognizing that the Environmental Action Club worked directly with The Food Service Director Luci Johnson in order to figure out the details for this plan.

Therefore, Let it be Enacted: SGA will provide \$2000.00 for the caf to switch over to biodegradable materials.
